### ECP RESUMES ACTIVITIES ON LIMITED SCALE

From September 2021, ECP resumed its activities on a limited scale maintaining full Covid - 19 protection protocol including measuring temperature, wearing masks, maintaining social distance and using sanitizer.



# MTB SPONSORED EYE CAMPS:

The Eye Care Program of Manabik Shahajya Sangstha (ECP-MSS) provided free eye care services to the underserved at four eye camps held at Panchagarh, Thakurgaon, and Manikgani on September 21, 25, 28, and 29. These eye camps were sponsored by the Mutual Trust Bank Limited (MTB). Technical support to the eye camps were provided by ECP's partner hospitals - Shafiuddin Ahmed Foundation (SAF) Hospital, Thakurgaon and Katrasin Eye Hospital, Shibaloy, Manikganj.

Free eye treatment including cataract surgeries were provided on September 21 at Dondopal Union Parishad, Debigani, Panchagarh; on September 25 at Toria Union Parishad, Atowari, Panchagarh; on September 28 at Nekmorod Union Parishad, Ranishankail, Thakurgaon; and on September 29 at Baniajuri Union Govt. School & College, Ghior, Manikganj. Representatives of the MTB were present at the camps.

## **SURGERIES AT CHAPAI:**

On 18th September 2021, Bangladesh National Blind Society, Chapainawabgani branch Chapainawabgani Eye Hospital provided free eye care service for underprivileged people at Shanayatullah Shishu Shibaloy, Chapainawabganj. Sanad. continuation, Chapainawabganj Eye Hospital conducted one hundred (100) cataract surgeries on 23rd and 24th September, 2021. ECP-MSS sponsored these 100 cataract surgeries, on behalf of its esteemed donors which were performed at Chapainawabganj Eye Hospital.

At these four eye camps, comprehensive eye care services were provided to 764 underprivileged people by qualified doctors, technicians, and modern eve screening equipment. Prescriptions were issued to the patients. 108 free medicines and 152 spectacles were given out. Cataract was identified among 148 patients and 129 surgeries were successfully performed by ECP's partner hospitals. 52 masks were provided. In addition, 700 basic eye care awareness flyers and posters were distributed among the nationta
